SERVICES

- **Emergency Department:** full-service, 24-hour emergency department with 12 treatment rooms, one trauma bay, and one “safe room” for patients who may be experiencing a behavioral health crisis. Specifically trained to meet the needs of cardiovascular, trauma, and neurological emergencies.
 - **Surgery:** two surgery suites and one procedure room, seven private and preop/postop rooms and three recovery room bays; 24-hour coverage. Surgical services include general surgery, orthopedic, gynecological, obstetrical, endoscopy, podiatry, and pain management. Laparoscopic and endoscopic procedures performed.
 - **Medical/Surgical/Constant Care:** 27 inpatient rooms, with six dedicated to constant care. Telehealth available for specialty consults.
 - **Family Birthing Center:** six private labor/delivery/recovery/postpartum rooms, three mother/baby rooms, breastfeeding support, 24-hour rooming-in for infant bonding, newborn nursery, advanced fetal monitoring system, supportive services for expectant and new moms.
 - **Holly D. Sale Rehabilitation and Wellness Center:** physical, occupational, and speech therapy for adult and pediatric populations; pediatric feeding program; athletic rehabilitation; hand therapy; dry needling; lymphedema therapy including breast cancer specialists; brain injury specialists with training in vestibular/concussion rehabilitation; pelvic floor rehabilitation; cardiac and pulmonary rehab; nutritional counseling.
 - **Sleep Disorders Lab:** diagnosis and treatment of sleep-related disorders in adults and children. Full hospital sleep lab and home sleep studies available.
 - **ATU Clinic:** outpatient monitoring and dosing of certain blood-thinning medications.
 - **Physicians Specialty Clinic:** houses specialty physicians who travel to Huntington on scheduled weekdays to accommodate the needs of patients for consultation visits, follow-up visits, and/or procedures for cardiology, urology, pain management, pulmonology, sleep medicine, and virtual endocrinology, integrative medicine, and rheumatology.
 - **Diagnostic Services:** 3D mammography, 3D ultrasound, CT scan, MRI, nuclear medicine, DEXA scan, echo, HeartSmart CT scan, SmartLung CT Scan, laboratory procedures.
 - **EMS:** paramedic ambulance service operated by PHH for Huntington County and surrounding areas.
 - **Medication Infusion Unit:** features a dedicated RN; specializes in chemotherapy disconnects, outpatient medications, infusions, transfusions, and central line care; lab draws available.
 - **Parkview Physicians Group:** primary care and specialty services on the hospital campus and in several locations in Huntington County.
 - **Parkview Center for Wound Healing:** coordinated care for treatment of chronic, nonhealing wounds. The center includes two hyperbaric chambers and clinically proven treatment options. Experienced physicians, nurses, and staff trained for chronic wounds.
 - **Cardiopulmonary:** PFTs, 24/48 hour Holter monitors, 7–30 day cardiac monitors, cardiac stress tests, EKGs, and EEGs.
